Golden Prayer Buckets

Have you ever felt like your dreams and prayers seem out of place? Maybe they appear too far-fetched. Beyond what you could ever hope to experience. Unattainable.

Or perhaps the longings of your heart feel random. You may have experiences similar to mine, where you're suddenly praying for things you hadn't thought of-needs you didn't know, or people you haven't seen in years.

God likes to involve us in what He is doing. He desires to use your prayers to bring His will to earth. I love the description in Revelation 5 of incense presented before the Lamb of God. Not just *any* pleasant scent. "Golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of the saints" (Revelation 5:8). Our prayers are a fragrant offering before the Lord. In Revelation 8, we see a direct correlation between our prayers and God's supernatural involvement on earth.

Another angel, who had a golden censer, came and stood at the altar. He was given much incense to offer, with the prayers of all God's people, on the golden altar in front of the throne. The smoke of the incense, together with the prayers of God's people, went up before God from the angel's hand. Then the angel took the censer, filled it with fire from the altar, and hurled it on the earth; and there came peals of thunder, rumblings, flashes of lightning and an earthquake. **Revelation 8:3-5**

I won't pretend to know or understand all the messages hidden in the book of Revelation. But one thing I do know, God stores our prayers and responds to them. I imagine golden prayer buckets for every need, every dream, and every person.

Don't be discouraged or dissuaded if your requests seem outlandish. Perhaps God is using you to fill a unique bucket.

Take courage if the answers you seek seem a long way off. Christ actually tells us to be squeaky wheels as we make our requests before God-to "always pray and not lose heart" (Luke 18:1). Maybe you're contributing to an extra large bucket.

Even should we make terrible mistakes and fall into pitch-black, scary places, the darkness is not dark to God.

Remember this truth the next time an unfortunate turn of events catches you off guard. God knew it was coming, and He's not going to leave you hanging. His thoughts towards you are innumerable and your value is incalculable. Rest knowing that the Lord of Heaven has your back, and your front.

Perseverance

Just a little bit more!

That phrase is the first thing that springs to mind at the thought of perseverance. The activity changes constantly, but the drive is the same. From working out to meeting deadlines, and even painful character building—to withstand, hold firm, just a little bit longer.

I love the quote from Harriet Beecher Stowe:

Amazing how, in that small window where I think I cannot hang on a minute longer, miracles happen. Moments that require perseverance are rarely pleasant. No one struggles to persevere as they eat their favorite dessert. My *a little bit more* quest for sleep is more like indulgence than endurance. No. It's in the times of consequence. Waiting. Seeking. Yearning. Forging. In these seasons we push ourselves to persist. And it's hard! James wasn't kidding when he called it work.

Let perseverance finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything. **James 1:4**

But he was also right when he exhorted us to consider it joy.

Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance ... Blessed is the one who perseveres under trial because, having stood the test, that person will receive the crown of life that the Lord has promised to those who love him. James 1:2-3, 12

Perseverance requires just *a bit more* but it also provides just *a bit more* joy. The triumph of a turning tide brings more than a relief from the trial at hand. Allow yourself to grow, give, and persist *a little bit more*, because God is bringing something incredible around the bend. We're rooting for you!

I can honestly say that the practice of giving thanks has changed my life. It causes me to focus on the extraordinary goodness of God and realigns my perspective in difficult times. One of the quickest ways I know to draw near the Lord is through gratitude.

Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise; give thanks to him and praise his name. **Psalm 100:4**

Feeling distant from God? Trying to draw near but unable to get past your present surroundings or current predicament? Give thanks, and you'll find yourself approaching the Lord's holy courts in no time.

Even as I (Jen) write this, I'm facing a bit of difficulty. With unpleasant circumstances and a few concerns looming overhead, I am tempted to approach God from a place of need, rather than generosity. Yes, there are times to come before the Lord and rely on His strength. But I encourage you just as I exhort myself, first seek to draw closer to Him with thanksgiving and praise. Especially in times of desperation, give thanks for who He is and what He has done in your life. Proclaim appreciation for what He has yet to do. For what He will do.

- 6. Our creator. (2 Chronicles 2:12, Psalm 139:14)
- 7. For His instruction. (Psalm 16:7, Psalm 119:171)
- 8. He hears our cries for mercy. (Psalm 28:6)
- 9. He shows the wonders of His enduring love. (Psalm 31:21, Psalm 106:1)
- 10. Our hope even when our souls are downcast. (Psalm 43:5)
- 11. The One we rely on. (Psalm 59:17, Psalm 71:6)
- 12. He daily bears our burdens. (Psalm 68:19)
- 13. For bestowing beauty instead of ashes. A garment of praise instead of a spirit of despair. (Isaiah 61:3)

Rest

When was the last time you rested? I mean truly took time for rest. Beyond the five minutes between snooze alarms in the morning and more than the end-of-the-evening crash.

On day 7 of our 31 days of encouragement, I echo our Father's call: Daughter of God, rest!

He created the Sabbath rest for a divine purpose—a lesson that's taken me much too long to learn. I'm a Type A personality, a worker bee. For years I took pleasure, and pride even, in how little I rested. That is, until I'd crash.

But head-on-collisions with fatigue are not part of God's perfect provision for our lives. He longs to refresh you, to replenish your spirit. He consecrated one out of every seven days for rest, and personally honored its holiness.

Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days you shall labor, and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the Lord your God ... For in six days the Lord made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested on the seventh day. Therefore the Lord blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy. **Exodus 20:8–10a, 11**

More than giving yourself *permission* to rest, *instruct* yourself to rest. Take time to honor the Sabbath, the Lord of all Creation established it for you. For years, I reasoned I just didn't have time to slow down. I saw it as a luxury, not a commandment. Opting out of rest meant rejecting an aspect of God's provision in my life. Don't repeat my mistake. God will make the time for your refreshment. Let your hope lay secure in God and release yourself to the rest only He can give.

Unless the Lord builds the house, those who build it labor in vain. Unless the Lord guards the city, the guard keeps watch in vain. It is in vain that you rise up early and go late to rest, eating the bread of anxious toil; for he gives sleep to his beloved.

We are redeemed. Set free. Jesus paid the ultimate price, praise His holy name!



Joy is meant to be shared—to overflow in our words and interactions. May your joy abound, not trapped down in your heart, but richly flavoring every interaction and life experience.

May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit. **Romans 15:13**



Start Where You Are

"Start where you are. Use what you have. Do what you can." – Arthur Ashe

I love this quote from the late Arthur Robert Ashe, Jr., famed professional tennis player and human rights activist. He's also credited with these inspiring words:

So today, we start where we are. And ... go! :)

Strength

I'll just be honest. Sometimes I don't feel strong. Other times it's even worse, and I feel weak ... exhausted ... lost.

We're taught that only the strong survive. To put on a brave face and soldier on. But what happens when I can't soldier anymore? When my arms aren't strong enough for the task, and my heart can barely hold on to the last strands of hope?

My Jesus reminds me that He didn't choose me for my strength. It's not because of what I can do on my own that He called me. Rescued me. It's because in my weakness His strength shines.

On day's when my stamina waivers and I'm more stumbly than sturdy, I rejoice in Psalm 118.

verse 1: Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good;

His love endures forever.

verse 8: It is better to take refuge in the Lord

than to trust in humans. (and that includes trust in myself!)

verses 13–17: I was pushed back and about to fall, but the Lord helped me.

The Lord is my strength and my defense; He has become my

salvation.

Shouts of joy and victory resound in the tents of the righteous:

"The Lord's right hand has done mighty things!

The Lord's right hand is lifted high; the Lord's right hand has done

mighty things!"
I will not die but live,

and will proclaim what the Lord has done.

If today is one of your rocky days, prepare to be amazed. God is your strength and your defense. He longs to do mighty things on your behalf. His hand is at the ready, and He will make His light shine upon you.

verse 27: The Lord is God, and He has made His light shine on us.

Renew yourself in His strength.
